

## OSHA Safety Seminars: Fall Protection

This seminar is tailored for contractors, manufacturing companies, field engineers and other individuals in the construction industry who are exposed to falling safety hazards. Fall Protection violations are more frequently cited. Each year, falls consistently account for the greatest number of fatalities in the construction industry, and are always a major concern in other industries. Events surrounding these types of accidents often involve a number of factors, including unstable working surfaces, misuse of fall protection equipment, and human error. Studies have shown that the use of guardrails, fall arrest systems, safety nets, covers, and travel restriction systems can prevent many deaths and injuries from falls.

Every year, many workers are injured or lose their lives in accidents that could have been prevented had the proper training and hazard identification education been performed. One study shows that falls are responsible for more than 33% of all deaths on construction sites. The scope of the seminar includes an understanding of the general requirements for OSHA CFR 1926 Subpart M, the requirements for the use of protective systems, identification of fall hazards, liability with respect to subcontractors, Attendees will receive a seminar workbook that details the discussion presented in the program.
